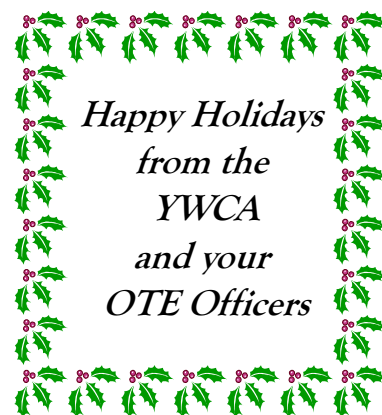

Hello Neighbors! Winter is fast approaching so please remember to clear your sidewalk and steps no later than 12 hours after each snowfall. The cleared path must be at least 36 inches wide and run the entire length of your property. Snow may not be deposited in the street, but should be left on the sidewalk next to the curb. Olde Towne East has a snow blower available for use, so if you're interested in learning how to use it, please let us know. A training session is being planned for Wednesday, December 7 at 6 PM. We do require that you be a member of OTE and clear your entire block. You should also be aware that should a snow emergency be declared by the City of York, all vehicles must be moved from Market, Queen and Princess Streets to other streets or City lots. Lots are located at Howard and Newton, Duke and Princess and 150 S Duke St. Hope all of you have a safe and merry Christmas and a happy New Year.

Now is Time for Final Fall Clean-up

Time to clean out your yards and house and street gutters! Now that the leaves have fallen, it's important that you clean out and pick up the leaves before your drains become clogged. Street sweeping for most city streets ended on Tuesday, November 15, but city-wide yard waste pick-up continues through December 15 so now is the time to complete your final preparations for winter. City residents may also take yard waste to Memorial Park on Saturday, December 3 between 10 AM and 2 PM.



Remember that street sweeping is in effect for several Olde Towne East streets year-round. Fines are \$50 for parking on the west side of Pine Street between King and Maple between 7:15 AM and 11:45 AM on the 1st and 3rd Fridays and on the east side of the street on the 2nd and 4th Fridays. Vehicles parked on the west side of Queen Street between King and Boundary between 7:15 AM and 11:45 AM on the 1st and 3rd Fridays and on the east side of the street on the 2nd and 4th Fridays are subject to ticketing AND TOWING.
